What is a cookie?

A cookie is a small file which asks permission to be placed on your computer’s hard drive. A cookie does not give us access to your computer or any information about you, other than the data you choose to share with us.

How do cookies work?

Once you agree, the file is added, and the cookie helps analyse web traffic or lets you know when you visit a particular site. Cookies allow web applications to respond to you as an individual. The web application can tailor its operations to your needs, likes and dislikes by gathering and remembering information about your preferences.

Why do we use cookies?

We use cookies to help us provide you with a good experience with Talking Medicines services.

What type of cookies do we use?

Cookies also known as; HTTP cookie, web cookie, Internet cookie, browser cookie, or simple cookie, are relevant for Talking Medicines services. We use analytical cookies with third parties. The data processing details are stated within our Privacy Policy.

What are the purposes for which you intend to use these cookies?

We use analytical cookies in order to collect information about how people use Talking Medicines services– for example, the number of users on our website, how long they stay on the site for, and what parts of the site they visit.

We also use strictly necessary cookies that are required for the operation of our site.

The expiry of cookies depends on their purpose and therefore there is no typical duration. The use of the cookies is proportionate and limited to what is necessary. For example, certain cookies expire when you close your browser.
